

Legal duty and service of the 2 witnesses at wedding ceremony

Marriage Act of Ontario requirement: Your marriage is legal, only if the 2 witnesses (18 year-old or above) have personally watched your authorized Marriage Officiant/Rev (Reverend) sign on (1) your Marriage License and (2) the Marriage Register during your wedding ceremony. Photos and videos must record the actual signing as proof to make sure that your marriage is 100% legal. **Secretly signing before or after the wedding ceremony is NOT proper and NOT legal and your marriage is NOT legal.**

Canada Immigration Law OP2 (2006-11-14) Processing Members of Family Class, p.36 warns: Marriage officiated NOT properly and NOT legally is NOT legal (Annulment). If your authorized Marriage Officiant/Rev does NOT SIGN on the 2 legal marriage documents during your wedding ceremony, your marriage is not legal. It is “**non-compliance with statutory established procedure.**”
